The course is aimed at developing all aspects of musicianship including daily individual string lessons, accompaniment sessions with piano, and a strong emphasis on chamber music. Courses are carefully structured to the needs of each individual student. There are solo opportunities with the orchestra and daily evening concerts for solos and chamber music performances by students and staff. There will be orchestral excerpts classes if required. The senior course is ideal for Conservatoire students preparing for end of year recitals. There are only 14 places available on this course.



Courses

Vanessa David (Violin/Viola) Course Director

Principal 1st violin with Royal Ballet Sinfonia, which she has led at venues such as the Barbican and Symphony Hall and is mentoring scheme co-ordinator. In her freelance career she has guest led National Symphony Orchestra of Ireland, London City Ballet, Welsh Chamber Orchestra and London Concertante; co-led the Ulster Orchestra, English chamber Orchestra and Bournemouth Sinfonietta; Worked with Academy of St. Martin's in the Fields and ROH. Broadcast as a soloist on Radio 3, Radio Wales, BBC Wales & HTV. She teaches at Junior Guildhall and coaches many youth orchestras and has coached or given masterclasses for the Royal Academy of Music and Birmingham Conservatoire.

William Bruce (Cello)

William Bruce is Head of Strings at Junior Guildhall, a passionate music educator, William is much in demand in the UK for masterclasses, workshops, summer schools and insets and he ran a residential summer school for cellists each year. In addition to many years experience as an adjudicator, William is a Consultant Moderator for the ABRSM. He studied with Christopher Bunting and took part in classes with Jacqueline du Pré and William Pleeth. He also attended chamber music courses at the Britten-Pears School for Advanced Musical Studies with the Amadeus Quartet. He has been a visiting professor at the University of South Carolina and was a member of the orchestra of English National Opera since 1982.

Ben Holland (Violin)

Ben has classes at the Royal Northern College of Music (where he was awarded a professorship in violin in 2016) and Chetham's School of Music, and undertakes consultative classes in orchestral and contemporary techniques at conservatoires throughout the UK. He also teaches a small class of talented young musicians at the Junior RNCM. As a chamber musician he was a founder member of the Matisse Piano Quartet, the Music Group of Manchester and the Victoria String Quartet, recording regularly for the BBC. An experienced orchestral leader, he has been guest leader of many of the country's major orchestras, including the Hallé, Royal Liverpool Philharmonic, Royal Phiharmonic Orchestra, Northern Sinfonia, Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra, City of Birmingham Symphony Orchestra, Scottish Ensemble, Orchestra of Opera North and the BBC Philharmonic Orchestra.

Errika Horsely (Viola)

Errika Horsley is Principal viola of the Royal Ballet Sinfonia, and previously held a position in the RTE National Symphony Orchestra in Dublin. She has also performed and recorded with other orchestras such as the London Symphony Orchestra and BBC Symphony Orchestra and for film sessions with the Chamber Orchestra of London. Errika is also passionate about teaching and coaching young musicians in preparation for music college and beyond.

Robert Gibbs (Violin/Viola)

Robert Gibbs has been leader of Royal Ballet Sinfonia since 1998. He is also leader of the London Festival Orchestra, and guest leader for the Royal Opera House, Netherlands Ballet, BBC Philharmonic, New Queen¹s Hall, Tokyo New City Symphony, and Sapporo Symphony orchestras, as well as the Osaka Opera, Kyushsu Symphony and Komaki-Shi orchestras for K Ballet. His recordings include the violin and piano works of Arnold Bax, and "The Lark Ascending".

Rebecca Selley (Piano/Accompanist)

Rebecca studied piano and piano accompaniment at the Royal College of Music where she won the John Ireland Prize for accompanists, and played for masterclasses given by, amongst others, William Pleeth, Dorothy Delay and Benjamin Luxon. More recently she has played in masterclasses for such eminent musicians as Maxim Vengerov, James Ehnes, Dong-Suk Kang, Roger Chase, Simon Rowland Jones, Alban Gerhardt, Thomas Carroll, Boris Garlitsky, Rachel Podger and Pamela Frank. She has given piano trio recitals with The Vale Piano Trio and is a regular pianist in the BBC NOW chamber series. She has made frequent appearances at the Wales Millennium Centre, including accompanying competitors of the Menuhin Competition. Rebecca also works as an accompanist for BBC National Orchestra of Wales, Welsh National Opera and Royal Welsh college of Music and Drama.
